The corona virus pandemic brought severe disruptions to the world. It also presented to scientists a unique opportunity to rapidly develop vaccines as key interventions in the absence of therapeutic agents. This study addresses this important issue. The acceptability of vaccines may be debatable in the light of some conspiracy theories. The study will use a cross-sectional design and a structured pre-tested interviewer-administered tool to investigate the research questions of acceptability, hesitancy, and willingness to pay. The sample size is 1,000 residents.
